points. McDurmon was the individual hero of the meet. He set two records to win first places in the high and low hurdles, tied for second place in the broad jump, and finished in a three-cornered tie for first in the high jump.

White, Boyne City's star performer, almost duplicated McDurmon's fine work. He broke records in the 100-yard sprint and the broad jump and then ran up another first place in the 220-yard dash for a total of 15 points.

Harold Stein, Monroe's great pole-vaulter, soared to a new height of 12 feet 2 3/8 inches as the only record-breaking performance in Class A competition. Kolbe, Saginaw Eastern ace, ran a 100-yard sprint heat in the morning in 9.7 for a new mark, but it was not allowed in view of a strong wind at his back. He took the final in 10 flat.

Trojans Bag Lone First

Southern California's only winner was Bob Lyon, in the 110-meter high hurdles, in which his teammate, Juddy Wolah, was the victim of a bad fall midway in the race. Bath, of Michigan State, was third. This was one of the few Trojan setbacks, as the champions came through otherwise in fine style. They placed two point winners in the 100, 400, the high hurdles, the broad jump, the high jump and the javelin.
