**P. H. Track Team Clicks**

Port Huron High school track team set four new records for the Roosevelt track Friday, in carrying off the honors in dual meet with St. Clair High school. The final score, Port Huron 58, St. Clair 37.

Records for the distance runs on this track cannot be compared with standard track records, because the Roosevelt track, which is supposed to be 440 yards to a lap, is known to be short, but has never been accurately measured. Therefore the mile run, four laps, is regularly made in times which would be world records, if the distance were correct.

In Friday's meet, Linteau covered the four laps in 3:38 breaking the old mark of 4:05. Smith, St. Clair, took second place in the event and Delore, S. C. third. Bond covered two laps in 1:43 as compared with his own mark made in 1932 of 1:49. Ashley, P. H., took second in this event and Hildner, S. C., third. Campbell covered one lap in 43.3 which broke the 43.68 record set by Chase of St. Clair in 1930. Smith, S. C., took second place and Bradley, P. H., third in Friday's race. The relay team of Durant, Hazlette, Pollock and Campbell stepped two laps in 1:29 to break the old record of 1:22.
