## Flint High Teams Finish Well Back of the Leaders

### Grand Rapids South Noses Out Saginaw Entry for Second Place—McMillan, of Northern, Ties for Vault Title.

EAST LANSING, May 26. — (By AP)—Ten records were broken and another equalled while three new champions were being pushed to the front in the Michigan high school track and field meet today. Centerville High school was the only team to repeat for the title, taking first place in the Class D for the fourth consecutive year.

Grand Rapids Ottawa Hills collected 35 points for a wide margin of victory in Class A, taking over the crown worn last year by Kalamazoo Central. Grand Rapids South was second with 23 1-10 points and Saginaw, after losing Bob Kolbe, its outstanding sprinter, through an injury, placed third with 22 1/2.

Other teams finished in following order: Ann Arbor 18, Cross Pointe 13, Grand Rapids Union 10, Monroe 9 1/2, Flint Northern 8 7-10; Flint Central and Wyandotte 8 each, Kalamazoo 7, Muskegon and Royal Oak 6 each, Fordson 5, Lansing Central 4 1-2, Mt. Clemens and Muskegon Heights 3 each, Lansing Central 2 1-5, Grand Rapids Tech 2, Ferndale 1-5, MacMillan Ties in Vault.

Herbert McMillan, star Northern pole vaulter, accounted for the only first place by a Flint athlete. He tied the height of 11 feet 9 inches made by the 1933 champion, Harold Stein, of Monroe, to gain a deadlock for premier vault honors. Gordon Gilbert was second in one sector of the 440-yard dash and Ben Clochon tied for fifth in the pole vault to account for Northern's other points.

The Central scoring was done by John Thomas, Ferris Hamel and Nick Sueli. Thomas, state quarter-mile champion in 1933, trilled Zep, of Ann Arbor, to the tape by a yard. The winner was clocked in :51.4 in theuster of the two "440" sections, Hamel was third in the 220-yard low hurdles and Sueli was fifth in the shot put.

The Class B title went to Dowagiac, and Paw Paw was the winner in Class C. Dowagiac, with 23 points, was closely followed by Dearborn and River Rouge which had 22 each and Niles, which collected 21. Paw Paw took 20 1-5 points, just ahead of East Grand Rapids, which finished with 26.

Centerville's repeat for the Class D title was decisive. Its 51 1/2 points were scored in 11 of the 13 events. Bergland High school came down from the upper peninsula to place second with 34 points and Saranac was third with 17 1/2.

1933 Champions Fall  
The 1933 champions in the three top classes failed to show strength today. In Class A, Kalamazoo accounted for only seven points, and Birmingham, which won the Class B championship last year, failed to take a point. Buchanan took only six points while attempting to defend its Class C championship.

Lorimer Moss, of Kalamazoo, set the only new record for Class A. His time of 4:31.3 for the mile run erased the old time of 4:32.2 set by Ray Swartz, also of Kalamazoo, in 1928.

Class B athletes set new standards for the pole vault, 100-yard dash and shot put. Arthur Frontczak, of Dowagiac, won the century dash in 16.2, shaving a tenth of a second off the record set by Davis, of St. Joseph, in 1927. The vaulting in this class was the best shown today. Gayle Oldt, of River Rouge, clearing 11 feet 11 7-8 inches for a new mark. Frank Kopplisch, of Dearborn, with a heave of 48 feet 10 5-8 inches, added two feet to the shot put mark made by Bernard McNutt, competing for Allegan, four years ago.

The winning Paw Paw 880-yard relay team was timed in 1:34.7 clipping a tenth second off the record set by Kalamazoo State High in 1932.

threw the shot 47 feet 9 1-2 inches to add a foot and a half to the mark set by Payntch, of Paw Paw, last year.

Walter Gets 16 Points  
Leslie Walters accounted for 16 points in Centerville's winning total, with first place in the high and low hurdles and broad jump and a fifth in the shot. He set a new class in the record of 16.6 seconds in the 120-yard high hurdles, replacing his own mark of 17.1 set a year ago.

A new Class D mark for the pole vault was set by Ralph Borsoth, of Bergland, who cleared 11 feet 4 1-2 inches, bettering the record of 11 feet 7-8 inches made two years ago by Blanga, of Ellsworth. Marks for the Class D mile and shot also fell and the relay time was equalled.

Centerville High school won its fourth successive Class D championship with 51 1-2 points. Far behind in second place was Bergland, upper peninsula entry, with 34 points. Other teams finished as follows: Saranac 17 1-2, Diamonddale 16, Ankenona 12, Maple Rapids 11 1-2, Bear Lake 10, Lakeview 8, Merrill Sacred Heart 7 1-2, Howard City 7, Napoleon 6, Columbusville 4, Baldwin and Lansing Hill school 3 each, Hanover 1.

Dowagiac won a hip and tuck fight for premier state honors among Class B schools.

Dowagiac nosed ahead with 23 points with Dearborn and River Rouge tied just behind the leader in second place with 22. Niles took third with 21.

Other teams finished in the following order: South Haven and Allegan 18 each; Escora and St. Joseph 13 each, Alma 9, Cadillac and Three Rivers 8 each, East Lansing 7, Big Rapids 6, Redford Union 4, Wayne, Mt. Pleasant, Fremont, and Charlotte 2 each.
