Hail 3 New State Prep Track Champs

EAST LANSING, Mich., May 28 (AP).—There were three new champions today in Michigan high school trackdom while a fourth pennant went back to the little school where it has waved since 1831.

Grand Rapids Ottawa Hills, Dowagiac and Paw Paw high schools emerged as the new champions in the annual state high school track and field meet here Saturday. Centreville, the perpetual winner of the small school bracket, retained its title for the fourth consecutive year.

Ten new records were placed in the books by the 500 athletes and one record was equalled during the meet. Class D competitors went on a rampage to hang up four new marks and equal a fifth. Three records were established in class B competition, two in class C and one in class A.

Grand Rapids Schools Lead

Ottawa Hills scored 35 points to win the class A title and premier track honors outside the Detroit league. Grand Rapids South was second with 23 7-10 points. The meet favorite, Saginaw Eastern, drew up in third place with 22½ points after its star sprinter and versatile entry, Bob Kolbe, pulled a muscle in the preliminaries, keeping him out of competition. Kalamazoo Central, the defending champions, finished far down the list with only seven points.

Lorimer Miles, of Kalamazoo, set the only class A record, running the mile in 4:31.3 to erase the old record of 4:32.2 made by Ray Swartz, former Kalamazoo and Western State Teachers star.

Dowagiac Wins by a Point

Dowagiac was hard pressed in winning class B honors with 23 points. Just behind the leader were Dearborn and River Rouge with 22 each, while Niles, the 1933 runner-up, collected 21 points. Birmingham, last year's winner, failed to score.

St. Joseph, with five men entered, placed three of them in four events to score 13 points. Erickson placed second in the pole vault, Merritt second in the 440-yard dash, only a step behind the victor; and Vinty Davis third in the 220-yard dash and fourth in the 100-yard dash.

Class B athletes set new records in the 100-yard dash, pole vault and shot. Gayle Oldt, of River Rouge, reached the highest vaulting ceiling of the meet with a record height of 11 feet 11½ inches, breaking the 11-6

Kalamazoo Central's veteran tennis team won the regional tournament conducted in the twin cities Saturday which a total of eight points and qualified for the state finals this week. The Kalamazoo squad took an early lead and maintained it throughout.

Centreville Star Leads

Centreville scored in all but two events and piled up an impressive total of 51½ points. Bergland, the upper peninsula entry, was second with 34. Class D athletes set new records in the pole vault, mile and shot and equalled the relay record.

The meet was a big personal triumph for Les Walters, of Centreville, high point winner of the day. He scored 16 points with firsts in the high and low hurdles and broad jump and fifth in the shot put.
