

## Prep Runners to Compete in Wayne Relay Carnival

Twenty High Schools Enter Inaugural Meet  
at Roosevelt Field Saturday

Wayne University's first annual relay carnival, with 20 high schools in Metropolitan Detroit entered, will be held at 2 o'clock Saturday afternoon at Roosevelt Field, Linwood and Tuxedo Aves. Eight events are on the program.

City High School League track athletes will have their first opportunity to win medals in this meet since the league abolished the presentation of individual prizes two years ago. Events are the 440, and 880-yard, mile, and 440-yard shuttle hurdle relays and a special 100-yard dash.

### Three Sections to Each Relay

Each relay will be divided into three sections, with the runners on the teams placing first, second and third in each section receiving gold, silver and bronze medals respec-

tively. The team winning first in each section also will receive a prize and the school having the best time in all three sections of one race will receive a cup.

The special 100-yard dash will be a re-run of the finals of this race in the City meet last week. Six boys who qualified for the final in the City meet—Louis Baines and Morris Barnes of Miller; Mike Killinger and Vincent Daly, of Cass Tech; George Zerbel, of Central, and Dorsey Gary, of Eastern, are eligible for the race. Gary placed first, Baines second, Barnes third and Killinger fourth in the City meet.

Two special relays also will be held. The Wayne University mile relay team of 1930 (City College of Detroit at that time) which won the Penn Relay championship, composed of John Lewis, Jim Russell, Adolph Lowenstine and Vic Spat-helf, will race against a quartet of present Wayne trackmen. The second special relay will be a 440-yard matched race between runners on the Tartar squad.

David Beauvais, manager of the carnival, has received entries from Eastern, Hamtramck, Southeastern, Western, Southwestern, Northern, Northwestern, Central, Cooley, Cass Tech, Mackenzie, Denby Pershing, Chadsey, Miller, Redford, U. of D. High, Fordson, Lincoln of Ferndale and Grosse Pointe high schools.
