The Muskegon - Heights - Grand Haven triangular meet showed the Big Reds starting to turn on the steam. Muskegon came through in every event to pile up points that put Heights and Grand Haven totally out of the picture. The big kick in this meet came when "Gibby" Sherman upset "Augie" Fabyan in the pole vault, where Fabyan was picked to drub his competitors.

The Big Reds entered the Regional Meet with the cream of class "A" competition, that could be found in this part of Michigan; the result was a lopsided Muskegon victory when, Heights and Kalamazoo bowed to the Muskies. Gayle Robinson walked off with four medals; he copped the high and low hurdles easily.

Bob Swanker took both the dashes and established a new record of 10 and 1/10 seconds in the 100 yard dash. Bob didn't have to run in the relay, therefore he coasted in the final stretch without exerting himself.

Tom McShannock, with little competition, easily took the high jump. The other individual who gave a good account of himself was Bob Bolthouse, who took second in the shot put. He has promise for the future, for this is only his sophomore year.

The boys walked off with over twentyfive medals, and a trophy for winning the regional meet twice in succession,
