Spencer Is Hair Off Mile Mark
Eastern and S'western Are Runners-Up

Hamtramck High's well balanced track team won the East Division indoor championship of the City League, Thursday at the Central track. The first Cooney, defending City champion, clocked 47.51 points in obstacle race, the title contest. The Lullans placed second with 44 points.

Third place in the East meet went to Southwestern. Miller was fourth with five points.

The title from Northwestern after the closing in the relay part of the West loop meet staged at the Central finished strong to defeat Southwestern, 46 to 34. Western was third with 21, closely pressed by Das Tech which counted 19 points.

Two records speedily were equalled in the East by Jim Knight, Hamtramck's first indoor champion. He was clocked in 20.64 in the 30-yard low stroke and a few minutes later equalled the league mark of 10.4 in the high hurdles.

Three In Blanket Finish

In both events there was a blanket finish between Knight, Bernard Lucas, of Eastern and his teammate Bill Rutland. Judges had some difficulty in determining the winner, so quickly did they finish. In the low hurdle event one of the three was a tenth second which caught Knight a shade under 10.4.

Lucas was the individual high score of the meet with 11 points. He won the high jump with a leap of 2 feet 11 1/2 inches and placed second in both hurdle events.

Knight's sensational hurdling gave him second scoring honors with 10 points.

Wilfred Spencer, Southwestern's mile, made a valiant effort to shatter the mile mark. Without being as pushed he was clocked in 4:23.4, a fourth of a second from the record. Spencer led the field in the last part of the race 20 feet and a lap. He ran a slow quarter, picked up his pace characteristically in a fast half mile but after that was set far out in front that not even Joe Paetz, Eastern star, could threaten him.

Winners of the first four places in both meets will meet in the City League finals at Central next Wednesday. The finals will be held in the same gym a week from Saturday.

In winning the half mile event in the East Contest, Harold Ray, of Hamtramck, and Dennis Schloop, of Eastern, staged one of the outstanding races of the day. Ray took the lead and set a fast pace for a quarter of a mile with Schloop a pace behind him.

Schloop caught the Cooney runner carrying two laps later when he spotted past him on a turn. Schloop stayed out in front until the last lap when Ray attempted to sprint past him. Cooney picked up the pace and the two ran side by side for almost a lap. Schloop slipped four before the finish and Ray, running well, won in 2:11.2.

Amos Clocks In 2:05.6

The best time in the half was turned in at Northwestern. Upson Amos, of Northwestern, won the event in 2:05.6. That Amos may shatter the City mark of 2:04.8 was indicated in the way he finished. He moved out in front of Alvin Cooney, of Southwestern, and his teammate Herman Haska, at the start and drew away from them throughout the race. He did not sprint at the tape although he was running easily and had plenty to spare.

Eastern, Northwestern, Hamtramck and Central relay teams are expected to be contenders for the title. Eastern won the East relay; the Colts captured the West event; the Cooney team is considered a threat as it Central because the latter team will be running on its own track.
