## Cosmos Take Sixteen Places

### Eastern Qualifies Nine for the Finals

Hamtramck High School's indoor track team earned qualifying positions in 15 of the 15 events Wednesday afternoon to set the pace for 14 other schools in the preliminaries of the annual City track meet at U. of D. Stadium.

The Cosmos placed boys for 16 individual positions and a relay team to lead Eastern, their strongest competitor, by seven places. The Indians, defending champions, placed boys in nine positions and a relay team.

Other schools to qualify for the meet to be held Saturday are Northwestern, Cooley and Central. The boys and a relay team were Veterans and Amherst. The girls' team, Southwestern, four and a relay team, Bedford, Ivesy, Cooley, Case Tech and Miller, two each, and Northern, Highland Park, Franklin, U. of D., and Hamtramck, one each.

Although Hamtramck took most of the team honors in the preliminary events, Eric Bohler, star hurdler, withdrew out of the meet by qualifying for three events.

**—Cosmos in Three Events**

Haver, a sprinter and hurdler who has dropped competing in three events to try his hand at the final events, qualified in the 800 yard dash 45.4 seconds, with the 25-pound shot 29.2 seconds and the 1600 yard relay with five places in the final 100 yard dash, but lost effort of the boys to the Cosmos in the 100 yard dash.

Haver's best was two and half better than he had before the meet qualified in both the 100 and 200 yard dashes. His best 100 yard dash was 20 feet 11 inches, while his best 200 yard dash was 42 feet 11 inches.

The fight for the team championship Saturday probably will be a race between Hamtramck, Veterans and Eastern's sprinters, Jimmy Knight, Charvel Cummings and Cooley Phillips, who won 15 points between them in the Cosmos meet.

If Eastern's two sprinters, Peter Christoff and Jack Pines, can have just as good a quality to have their championship in the 100 yard dash Wednesday by taking the second heat in the 100 yard dash, it will be the case of the 220 Charley Deane, of Detroit, and Morris Haver, of Miller, qualified in both of those events and should give the Cosmos boys the team championship.

**Has the Best Time**

The three Cosmos sprinters, Knight, Pines and Cummings, qualified in both the 100 and 200 yard dashes. The one of them who had the best time in the 100 yard dash, the 100 yard dash, was Pines, who had the best time in the 100 yard dash, 19.7 seconds.

William Spencer, of Southwestern, was the fastest in the 100 yard dash, but he was not in the meet. He had the best time Wednesday—11.4 seconds.

Hamtramck is expected to gain the majority of the points in the quarter-mile with three Cosmos in the race—Jimmy Knight, Jimmy Knight and Jack Pines. Pines, of Eastern, had the fastest time in the event Wednesday, 3.4 seconds.

But McMillan, who won another heat in the 100 yard dash, will be in the final.

With 15 points in the meet last night, Knight and Pines, who were qualified in two events, the 100 yard dash and 200 yard dash, probably will take both. His best time was 21 feet 11 inches in the 100 yard dash, the best of the meet, while he qualified in the 100 yard dash at 21 feet 11 inches and scored one jump.
