

New Regional Champs Arise

12 Prep Records Set in Meet at Ypsi

YPSILANTI, May 18—(A. P.)—Championships changed hands in each of the three classes in the ninth annual regional high school track meet here today which saw 12 new records established by the 300 boys entered in the competition.

Birmingham became the new Class B winner, South Lake took Class C honors, and Madison won the Class D crown. Dearborn held the B title, Marine City was defending C honors, and Napoleon finished second in seeking its second Class D title.

The outstanding performers were Wagenschutz, Plymouth, in Class B; Chase, South Lake, in Class C, and Whisonant, Madison, in Class D.

Wins Three Events

Whisonant, scored 19½ points with three firsts and a tie for another to lead the scorers; Wagenschutz followed with 18 points gained in three firsts and a third, and Chase scored 15 points with three winners.

Five of the new marks were set in Classes C and D with the other two being in B. A stiff wind slowed many of the performances and prevented additional record-breaking.

Okenos Qualifies Two

There will be 94 athletes from this region in the state championships next week at East Lansing. The number of qualifiers from each school follow:

Class B—Birmingham 9, Ecorse 5, Plymouth 5, Berkley 4, Dearborn 4, Howell 3, Ypsilanti 2, and East Detroit 2.

Class C—South Lake 5, Northville 5, Lincoln (Ypsilanti) 5, South Lyon 4, Marine City 3, Okenos 2, Roosevelt (Ypsilanti) 2, Belleville 2, Romulus 1, and Melvindale 1.

Class D—Petersburg 7, Madison 6, Napoleon 5, Lamberville, 5, Harver 2, Dayton Plains 2, Bloomfield Hills 1, Clayton 1 and Pittsford 1.

Ann Arbor Captures Meet

ANN ARBOR, May 18—Ann Arbor High School set a meet record in the half-mile relay to capture the event and win the annual A. A. A. A. League outdoor track championship at Ferry Field this afternoon. Ann Arbor scored 491.7 points. The Purple team, anchored by Waldo Abbott, ran the half-mile relay in 1:32.2. Abbott was the individual star of the meet, setting another new meet mark of 22.5 seconds in the 220.

Jackson finished in second place with 44.7 points; Lansing Central scored 43½; Lansing Eastern, 22.27; Battle Creek, 19.11.54.

In a regional meet for Class C schools, Algonac scored 54½ points to run away with first honors. Van Dyke, in second place, scored 20½.
