Watson Is Star of State High School Track Summaries

Meet WINS 3 EVENTS

Niles, Paw Paw and Bear Lake Preps Gain Titles

EAST LANSING, Mich., May 25.—To Saginaw Eastern in Class A; Niles, Class B; Paw Paw, in Class C, and Bear Lake, in Class D, went the victors' laurels in the twenty-ninth annual Michigan interscholastic track and field meet staged here Saturday.

The Trojan thincads of Saginaw had things all their own way, thanks to the herculean efforts of Bill Watson, Negro ace, who won three firsts for 18 points. His school piled up a total of 43 10-21 points to win in Class A. Monroe was second with 22 1-7, Muskegon and Flint Central shared third place with 19 points each and Grand Rapids Ottawa Hills finished fifth with 16.

Niles was out in front in the Class B chase with 34 points, while Allegan finished second with 27, Birmingham third with 22 7-10 and Dowagiac fourth with 2 2-5 points.

Only Repeater

Paw Paw, in Class C, was the only defending champion to repeat. The winners rolled up 36 6-7 points. The winners rolled up 36 6-7 points. South Lake was second with 21 6-7, barely nosing out Shelby which scored 21. Millington got 14 points for fourth and Northville was fifth with 11 1-2.

The closest race of the day developed in the battle for Class D honors. Bear Lake came through with 33 points and Madison was second with 29. Onekama scored 28, Saranac 25 1/2 and Lakeview 23 7-10 points.

Bill Wiess of Bear Lake, a Class D school, was the outstanding individual performer of the meet. He won four first places for 24 points to outshine Watson of Saginaw, who copped three blue ribbons. Wiess won the 220-yard dash, equaled the record in the century and hung up new marks in both the high jump and broad jump. Watson won the shot put with a record heave and topped the fields in the high jump and broad jump.

Busy Day

Allen Smith led the Paw Paw team to a victory by setting a broad jump record for Class C, equaling the existing mark in the 100-yard dash and winning the 220.

Gayle Robinson of Muskegon won both Class A hurdle races.

Six new records were established and two were equaled. Watson smashed the only Class A mark when he heaved the 12-pound shot 53 feet 10 1/4 inches to break the 25-year-old mark set by Korchler of Lansing Central at 51 feet 6 1/4 inches. No B records were changed.

Another Mark

Roy Breen of Grand Rapids Lee cleared 6 feet 3/4 inch in the Class C high jump to erase the mark of 5 feet 1 1/2 inches set in 1931 by McDurmon of Caro. Alan Smith of Paw Paw leaped 22 feet 6 1/4 inches to beat the broad jump record of 22 feet 1/2 inch set by White of Boyne City in 1933.

Tony Mandjiak of Kalamazoo St. Augustine beat the Class C shot put mark of 47 feet 9 1/4 inches set in 1935 by Vivian of East Grand Rapids, when he pitched the lead pellet 49 feet 1/4 inch. The C mark of 10 flat in the century was equaled by Smith of Paw Paw.

Wiess raised his own high jump mark in Class D when he cleared 5 feet 9 1/4 inches after jumping 5 feet 8 1/2 inches in 1933. He also set up a new record in the broad jump by leaping 20 feet 11 inches to shatter the mark of 20 feet 2 inches set by Mason of South Lake in 1930.

The frenzied throng had been so captivated by Owen's magic feats total points had been completely forgotten.

Wolverines Respond

It was sink or swim with Michigan as the relay teams swung around the first lap. But the quartet of Siles, Patton, Aikens and Birleson responded to the pleadings of their backers by taking the lead before the first lap was completed and holding it throughout for a new conference record of 3:15.2.

Indiana last season set a new mark with 3:15.9.

It was a colorful nerve-lingling finish to possibly the most colorful track meet that has ever been held.

Final figures found the teams lined up as follows:

Michigan 48, Ohio State 43 1/2, Wisconsin 29 1/2, Indiana 24 1/2, Northwestern 20, Iowa 19, Illinois 18 1/2, Purdue 11, Minnesota 10, and Chicago 1.

Ranking next to Owens for individual honors was Lash with victories in the mile and two-mile events. He has done much better time this year than he turned in for the two-mile, his specialty.

Willis Ward tied with Riegel of Illinois for first in the high jump and turned in the greatest leap of his life, 25 feet 1 1/4 inches, to place second to Owens in the broad jump.

Grieve of Illinois was the only other competitor to turn in as many as seven points.

In winning the team title, Michigan won first in the discus and mile relay; tied for first in the high jump and added to this three seconds, three thirds and four men who were listed as fifth place finishers.

In equaling the record for the 100-yard dash, Owens technically ran the distance faster than any human ever has. It was announced all of the watches showed him doing it 2-100 less than .094. But it will be placed in the record books only as a tie with smart track observers offering to wager any amount he will run the distance in :09.3 before the Summer is over.

Tolan Is Present

Among those who witnessed Owens race to glory was Eddie Tolan, the former Wolverine, who saw his conference record of :09.5 go a-glimmering.

Owens ran with such ease, grace and rhythm it appeared, especially in the century, he wasn't extending himself.

But just the same the gods who watch over the sanctum of sporting immortals are busy today—busy erecting the pedestal of glory for Jesse Owens, the blazing "Buckeye Bullet."

By his quartet of victories, Owens becomes the second man in Big Ten annals to register 20 points in a single meet. Carl Johnson of Michigan performed a similar feat in 1919 with firsts in the two hurdles, the high jump and broad jump.
