

# SAGINAW WINNER; CENTRAL IS THIRD

Indians Surprise by Tying  
Monroe as Greer Sparkles  
— Watson of Trojans  
Shatters Shot Put Mark.

MACKLIN FILED, East Lansing, May 25. — (By AP)—Three new team champions were crowned in the 25th Michigan High School Track and Field meet here this afternoon and one school—Paw Paw—retained the title it won last year. The champions: In Class A, Saginaw High School; Class B, Niles; Class D, Bear Lake.

William Watson, big Negro star, led the Saginaw team to victory. He scored three first places and established one new record for the meet. That was in the 12-pound shot put, in which he hurled the ball 53 feet 10 5-8 inches, more than two feet better than the old mark of 51 feet 6 5-4 inches. He also won the high jump and broad jump events.

Saginaw's well-balanced team scored points in 11 of the 13 events programmed for the meet, amassing a total of 43 10-21. Monroe high school was second with 22 1-7.

## Greer Takes Sprints

Flint Central surprised by tying for third place in Class A, equaling Muskegon's 19 points. Wilbur Greer, Flint's fine sprinter, won two first places, the 100 and 220, and took fourth in the broad jump. Central's relay team was fifth and Martin Werschky took fifth in the half mile. Flint Northern scored six points, Bruce Blackburn and Gordon Gilbert dividing them.

Grand Rapids Ottawa Hills, the defending champion, finished far down in the list of point winners.

Niles gave a convincing display of team strength to capture the Class B title. Although it won only one first place in the 880-yard relay, it scored enough points in seven other events to pile up a score of 24 and beat out Allegan, which had 27 points as its score. Dowagiac, the winner last year, finished fourth.

Paw Paw could credit its triumph in large measure to the work of Alan Smith, its dash man, who set a class record in the broad jump; tied the 100-yard dash record, and won the 220-yard dash.

South Lake, which had not been expected to show to advantage, won second place with a team total of 21 6-7 points.

## Wiese A One-Man-Team

William Wiese proved himself to be a track team all by himself in leading Bear Lake to its Class D title. As a day's work he set two records, tied another and won a first place. He beat his own record in the high jump, clearing the bar at 5 feet 9 1-4 inches, improving by 3-4 of an inch the mark he established in the 1934 meet. He also added nine inches to the broad jump record for the class with a leap of 20 feet 11 inches. He beat a mark that had stood since 1920.

Wiese also tied the record for the 100-yard dash, running it in 10.4 seconds, and led the field in the 220-yard dash, winning by a couple of strides.

The points in Class A were distributed as follows: Saginaw High 43 10-21, Monroe 22 1-7, Muskegon 19, Flint Central 19, Grand Rapids Ottawa 16, Grand Rapids Central 14 1-2, Grand Rapids Davis Tech 14, Grand Rapids South 12 1-2.
