

LOCAL HIGH JUMPER SETS CLASS C MARK

Roy Breen of Lee Clears Bar at 6 Ft. $\frac{3}{8}$ In. to Win Event; Ottawa Flash Qualifies.

East Lansing, May 25.—(A)—William Watson, Saginaw Eastern High school Negro, established a new state interscholastic meet record Saturday when he won the class A finals in the shot put with a heave of 53 feet 10 $\frac{3}{8}$ inches. The previous record was 51 feet 6 $\frac{1}{4}$ inches, set in 1910 by Koehler of Lansing.

Finals in eight field events were included in the morning's competition, to be sandwiched in among the qualifying events.

Meet officials said approximately 600 youths from 125 schools in every section in the state were participating in the meet.

Another record fell when Roy Breen of Lee High school, Grand Rapids, won the class C high jump with a jump of 6 feet $\frac{3}{8}$ of an inch. His mark replaced that set by McDurmon of Caro in 1931, 5 feet 11 $\frac{1}{2}$ inches.

Local Entrants Fade.

Grand Rapids and western Michigan contestants were fading first during the morning preliminaries. Bullen, Ottawa Hills speed merchant, made the grade in both the 100 and 200 yard dashes but ran behind Abbott of Ann Arbor and Greer of Flint. Lewis and Dykehouse, Tech's sprinters, were shut out in the 100 yard trials by drawing the fastest heat with Bullen, Abbott and Greer running against them.

Bishop, Ottawa hurdler, came through in the high hurdles as did McDonald of South. Both were slower, however, than Robertson of Muskegon. Brandel of South made the grade in the century, winning his heat.

In the 200-yard low hurdles all Grand Rapids entrants were blocked out. Palmer, ace timber topper from Central, failed in the lows as well as the highs.

Conlee of Allegan won his heats in both the dashes handily. Hop-pach of Fremont and Fowler of Fremont made the grade, the for-

mer in the high hurdles and the latter in the century. Zander of Tonia was the only western Michigan qualifier in the low hurdles.

Shelby Lad Qualifies.

In class C Hollack of Shelby qualified in the hurdles. All of the East Grand Rapids lads were shut out in the dashes and the hurdles. Weller of Martin was upholding the western Michigan prestige in class D in the dashes. Kohler of Lakeview and Garbow of Howard City qualified in the low hurdle event in class D.
