

Cosmo Trackmen Defeat Miller

Second in Row Won by Hamtramck

Hamtramck established itself as the leading contender for the City High School League indoor track championship Thursday afternoon by swamping Miller, 74 to 21, in a dual meet at Hamtramck. It was the second consecutive victory for the Cosmos.

In two other dual meets Thursday Northwestern easily won from Cass Tech, 45 to 23, at Cass Tech, and Eastern defeated Northern, 56 to 39, in a meet at Northern, Pershing outscored Northeastern, 59 to 36, at Northeastern; Cooley turned back Central, 64 2-3 to 30 1-3, at Cooley; and Redford beat Southwestern, 56 to 29, at Redford. The dashes were not held in the Northwestern-Cass Tech meet.

Jimmy Knight paced the powerful Hamtramck squad to its one-sided triumph. Knight won the low and high hurdles and ran on the winning 880-yard relay team. Miller won only two first places. Morris Barnes placed first in the 30-yard dash for the Trojans and Lawrence won the high jump.

Little Mike Master, star miler, was the only Cass Tech runner to win an undisputed first place as Northwestern turned in its triumph. Master was clocked in 5:07 on the Tech track. Northwestern won six first places and tied for first in the pole vault. Ulysses Amos led the Colt squad by winning the 220 and 440-yard dashes.

Earl Redmond took scoring honors as Eastern defeated Northern. The Indian star captured both the low hurdles and the high jump for a 10½-point total. The Indians won eight out of 11 first places.
