Cosmos Gain Record Total

Colts, Indians Each Land Third

Hamtramck High School put the finishing touches to its domination of East Side indoor track Thursday afternoon at the Central gym by winning five of the last six events to register the annual divisional meet with 42 1/2 points. The Cosmos' total is the highest registered by any City League team in an indoor track divisional meet.

Cody's well-balanced team turned in a mild surprise on the West Side by scoring 11 points in the last four events to take the championship with a 11 1/2 point total. Central, another school to finish strong in the sprint, placed second with 28 1/2 points while Northwestern, the defending champion, could do no better than third with 28 1/2 points.

Other schools to score points on the West Side were Bedford 21 1/2, Western 4, Oak Park 3 1/2, Eastern 2 and Southwestern 1 each. On the East Side Northwestern finished as runner-up to Hamtramck by gathering 25 points. Eastern, the defending City champion, was third with 11 1/2 points. Other East Side team scores were Dumbo 12 1/2 points, Allen 7 1/2, Northern 2 and Southwestern 1.

Hamtramck, paced by its all-around performer, Jimmy Knight, scored points in every event by tracking away with the East Side honors. Coach Floyd Stinson's squad won seven out of 11 first places. Knight took most of the time on the mile, placed third in the one and one-half mile, placed first in the six and one-half mile and was the only double winner on the East Side.

Fitzes Is Disqualified

One of the big surprises of the East Side meet came in the 30-yard dash, where Eddie Fitzgerald, of Hamtramck, edged out Carl Johnson, of Southwestern, for first place. In this event Jack Fitzes, the Eastern speedster who was the favorite, did not even run as he jumped the starter's gun twice and was disqualified. Art Evans, Hamtramck's coach, was the official starter and he was forced to throw out the best sprinter in a time both.

Bob Luby, of Central, took high scoring honors on the West Side by winning the 30-yard high hurdles, placing second in the one minute and running on the winning 800-yard relay team. Al Thomas, of Cody, was next in scoring points with a first in the low hurdles and a second in the high hurdles.
