

Two of the best hurdlers in Michigan will be going over the top for Saginaw High school at Houseman field here next Saturday, attempting to defend the state class A track title now held by that school. They are nearly equal in both barrier events and are shown in the 120-highs at the Flint regional last Saturday.
