

PREP STARS SET 4 NEW RECORDS

Monroe, Birmingham, Paw Paw and Onekama Capture State Track Titles.

SIX MARKS NOT ALLOWED

GRAND RAPIDS—(P)—Four new records went into the books as the state high school track meet crowned new team champions in three of its divisions and permitted the fourth to reign for another year.

Monroe high school took over the class A crown that Saginaw sought unsuccessfully to defend; Birmingham won Niles' class B throne; Paw Paw, in class C, alone was able to beat back its challengers, while Onekama by the narrowest of margins replaced Bear Lake as the ruler of class D schools.

The records took a severe jostling. In addition to the records that were

Battle Creek Central took two places in the state track meet at Grand Rapids, for a total of three points. Maxtrous placed third in the 440-yard event and Nichols was sixth in the 880-yard run. Lakeview did not place.

recognized officially, six other of the old marks were bettered but not allowed because the contestants ran with a strong wind to their backs.

Big Red Athlete Wins

Tycooki, of Lansing Central, took over the class A broad jumping record with a 22-foot, 11 3-4 inch leap that bettered by a fraction the mark that has stood since 1928.

Holgerman, Escanaba, turned in a 4:34.4 mile in class B that was three tenths of a second better than the three-year-old record, while Kinsey, of Plymouth, took a hard fall out of the class shotput mark. He threw the ball 50 feet, 8 3-4 inches, bettering the old record of 48 feet, 10 5-8 inches.

Mazey, of Middleton high school, a stripling who competed in corduroy trousers and canvas sneakers, set up a new pole vaulting record in class D, topping the bar at 11 feet 5 inches—a half inch better than the old one.

More than 800 boys competed in the full-day meet, that was brought here for the first time this year because its normal home—Michigan State college—is without a track temporarily.
