

CENTRAL TRACK MEN TIE FOR 5TH PLACE

Local Prep Team Also Brings
Back Laurels from State
Meet

TYCOCKI SETS RECORD

Winning three regional tennis championships and one golf title beside mopping up a share of glory in the state interscholastic track meet, Lansing and East Lansing high schools looked back Monday on one of the most successful week-ends in the athletic annals of the three schools.

To the Trojans of East Lansing went the tennis and golf titles in the regionals at Ypsilanti and Battle Creek respectively and sixth place in the state Class B track meet at Grand Rapids. Overshadowing this, Warren Tausky, slender captain, shot the best golf of the day at Battle Creek, including all classes, with a 79 that was gained under the most trying conditions. A blistering wind kept par far from the reach of the prep school shotmakers.

At Ypsilanti the undefeated Eastern tennis team gave the Yankees their eighth successive regional tennis championship by easily outstripping the Class A field with 14½ points. The victory of Jack MacInness and Leslie Kluit in the doubles was also the eighth straight tandem title for a Herb Fox coached team. Central's netmen won their regional at Jackson by outpointing Jackson and Battle Creek.

Weakened by the loss of two of its regulars, Eastern's golf team qualified for the state tournament by placing third in the Class A regional at Battle Creek. It was a sophomore, Ted Downey, who turned in the best Quaker card, shooting an 88. Central lagged way behind in eighth place with a team total of 401 points.

Reds Tie for Fifth

Central tied for fifth place with Ann Arbor in the state interscholastic track meet held at Grand Rapids Saturday which was won by Monroe. Eastern took eighth position honors with 64 points. Ted Tycocki, versatile Big Red athlete, smashed the Class A broad jump record with a leap of 22 feet 11½ inches that equaled by a fraction the mark that had remained unmolested since 1928. Bill Sikes, rugged Eastern runner, gave the Quakers a first in the 880 by beating out Don Dudley of Central who finished second. Central's half-mile relay team of Roberts, Fossum, Baker and Tycocki finished third behind Monroe and Ann Arbor teams.

Sixth place went to East Lansing's trackmen in the Class B meet. Birmingham copped first place with 27½ points while the Trojans' total was 14. Fulkerson took a third in the pole vault, Lynch third in the 100-yard dash, Drake in the 120-yard high hurdles, and Publow, fourth in the shot put.
