

Final Plans Are Ready For Track Meet At Chatham

Munising—Final plans are being made for the annual Alger county track and field meet at Chatham next Saturday and Coach Emil Peterson of the Mather high school announced yesterday that for over a month his boys have been doing some strenuous training which is beginning to show in results. Last Saturday the entire group were taken to the grounds at Chatham and put through their paces, and Coach Peterson says that his team will show some fine competition to other county teams Saturday.

The girls' team together with the baseball division has been practicing under Miss Madge Mayforth, director of physical education at the high school, and some good results are expected from them as well as from the boys.

The events for the county this year are in charge of R. W. Jackson, principal of the Mather high school. The executive board includes H. A. Wood, A. K. Jackson, R. E. Kehoe and I. S. Davis. Mr. Peterson of Chatham will have complete charge of the girls' baseball this year.

Girls' events besides baseball include in both classes, the 50 yard dash, 225 yard relay, baseball throw, running hop, skip and jump.

Four Class A baseball teams, those of Grand Marais, Munising, Eben and Tertiary will compete in the senior events which has as its reward the wooden plaque which is won by the school holding the championship three out of five years. In Class B seven schools are entered and a trophy is also given.

R. W. Nebel will present the trophies and Munising is in hopes to win the boys' class of keeping as a permanent trophy the symbol which they took last year. If they receive the highest number of points as a total in all events the trophy is theirs. Tertiary school holds the trophy for Class B.

The meet begins at promptly 8:30 central standard time.
