Bartlett Sets Javelin Mark

Makes 223-Foot Record in Event

GRAND RAPIDS, Mich., June 13. —(AP)—The University of Michigan won the combined West Michigan games, the Michigan A. A. U. championship and the Michigan Olympic tryouts today with overwhelming superiority in the running events.

The Wolverines scored 50 points. Michigan State's varsity was second, with 27, while Wayne University of Detroit was third, with 24. The Detroit Police Department teams scored 18 points to take fourth place.

Lee Bartlett, Union City school teacher who competed for the United States on the 1928 and 1932 Olympic teams, set a new domestic record for the javelin throw.

Bartlett threw the javelin 223 feet, 7 inches, breaking the record of 222 feet, 6 3/4 inches, set by James DeMers in 1930, which has stood since as the best javelin throw by a citizen of the United States. The American record is 238 feet, 7 inches, made by Matti Jarvinen, of Finland in the 1932 Olympic Games. Jarvinen also holds the world record of 249 feet, which he made in 1933.

William Watson, University of Michigan freshman, stepped into the record breaking class when he hurled the shot 48 feet, 10 1/4 inches. The best previous mark was set at Detroit last year by Watson. It was 45 feet, 10 inches. Watson also won the broad jump.

Michigan and Michigan State were awarded trophies for the winner and runner-up, respectively. Allan Tomlich, of Wayne, received the trophy for the highest individual point total. He scored 13 points.

Other points totals were: Great Lakes A. C., 17; Michigan Normal, 13; Western State varsity, 12; Michigan State freshmen, 9; Western State freshmen, 8; Grand Rapids Junior College, 8; Detroit Track Club, 7; Hope College, 2; University of Detroit, 2; Adrian A. C., 1.

Western Teachers Defeat State Nine

EAST LANSING, Mich., June 13. —(AP)—Western State Teachers College base ball team combined its own heavy hitting with sloppy Spartan fielding to defeat Michigan State College, 11 to 1, in an Alumni Day game here today.

More than 3,000 saw Michigan State defense collapse behind good pitching, with six errors going to the books alongside a dozen errors of judgment that made pitchers' records look bad.

David Arnold, pitching for Western State, permitted only eight scattered hits and had strong support when going was roughest. He had five strikeouts. Warren Walters pitched good for State despite weak support.
