

EAST LANSING, Mich., June 13. -(A)-Western State Teachers College base ball team combined its own heavy hitting with sloppy Spartan fielding to defeat Michigan State College, 11 to 1, in an Alumni Day game here today.

More than 3,000 saw Michigan State defense collapse behind good pitching, with six errors going to the books alongside a dozen errors of judgment that made pitchers' records look bad.

David Arnold, pitching for Western State, permitted only eight scattered hits and had strong support when going was roughest. He had five strikeouts. Warren Walters pitched good for State despite weak support,
