## Crack 2 Records

### 2 Individual Marks Also Broken

In between hail storms and showers the Varsity Lettermen's Club of Wayne University ran off its third annual Wayne University relays at Belle Isle, Wednesday.

Athletes from 20 schools took part in the six relays and five individual events, with Hamtramck, city indoor and outdoor champion, repeating its success of last year by winning three relays.

Hamtramck runners turned in the fastest time in the medley, half-mile and two-mile relays, establishing new meet records of 1:31 for the half-mile and 1:48.5 for the medley. Eastern held the old half-mile time of 1:32.7, while Hamtramck broke its own record of 1:51.3 in the medley.

#### OTHER RELAYS SPLIT

Miller's speedy sprinters captured the 440-yard relay, Cooley placed first in the shuttle relay, while Fordson's four quarter milers won the mile relay in 3:30.5.

Two records went by the boards in the individual events. Carl Garack, of Wyandotte, tossed the shot 49 feet 5 1/4 inches to surpass the former mark of 46 feet 1/2 inch set by Emil Lovati, of Eastern. Merrill Gottschalk, of Cooley, and Arthur Gutz, of River Rouge, tied for first in the pole vault at 11 feet 2 inches, two inches in excess of the height cleared last year by Willard Simmons, of Central.

The running high jump ended in a four-way tie for first between Carl Culver, of Central; Earl Redmond, of Eastern; Woodrow Wright, of Miller, and Harold Wagenschutz, of Plymouth, all of whom cleared 5 feet 11 1/4 inches.

#### MISSES RECORD

Culver just missed a record when he cleared 22 feet 3/4 inch in the running broad jump, his winning distance being only 3/4 of an inch under the leap that Barney Lucas, of Eastern, made a year ago.

Carl Calabrese, of Southeastern, was the winner in the other individual test, beating Walter Radzienda, of Hamtramck, city champion, in the 11-yard dash.
