

ALLEGAN LEADING IN CLASS B COMPETITION

High Hurdle and Two Sprint Marks Bettered by East Lansing; South Tops Class A Field.

With two events completed Saturday morning in class B and with the shotput and high jump in class A completed Friday, Allegan High and South of Grand Rapids were in the lead in the regional track and field meet at Houseman field early Saturday afternoon. Coopersville and Lowell, with 11 points each, were tied for first in class C.

Five records went by the boards during the morning competition. Leading the mark making was a mark of 16.4 in the class B high hurdles by Lee of East Lansing, besting a record of 17.1 set by Scales of the same school in 1935.

Lad Sets Two Records.

Mead, a teammate of Lee, cracked the 100-yard dash in the same class with a mark of 10.2. The former mark was 10.4 and was held jointly by Conlee of Allegan and Scally of Grand Rapids Catholic Central. Mead hung up a second mark when he tripped the 220-yard distance in 22.9 taking off the books Scally's name that has been there since 1931 when he went the distance in 23.1.

Two class C marks changed were those in the broad jump and high jump. Stauffer of Lowell cleared the bar at 5 feet 10 7/8 inches in the high leap while Laug of Coopersville made a running broad jump of 19 feet 11 inches to eclipse the old record of Edward of Williamston by three inches. This mark had stood since 1932. The old high jump mark was 5 feet 7 3/4 inches held jointly by Leach of Coopersville in 1932 and McCarthy of East Grand Rapids last year.

Hastings Second.

The point standings at the end of the morning work in class B showed Allegan ahead with 21, Hastings far behind in second with 6 1/2 and Charlotte third with 1/2. In class C, following Coopersville and Lowell, came East Grand Rapids with 5 and Grant with 3.

Although South failed to take a first in either of the early events, it placed two men in each for a total of 12 points. The major haul in points in Friday's trials came in the shot put, where Mitchell of South got off his best heave of the year so far to make 46 feet and second place. He was followed by Pifferella of South who threw 43 feet, 7 inches for third place.

Buster Wright, giant Negro lad from Davis Tech, won the shot as had been expected but failed to endanger the city record of 50 feet 3 inches. His best effort was 48 feet 7 1/2 inches. He has made better than 52 feet in practice this year but has failed to pass 49 feet in a formal meet.

Creston Second.

In the high jump Gordon Miller of Creston was in fine form, winning first at 5 feet, 9 1/4 inches, while a team-mate, Pierce, a dark-horse in the entry list, came into the points for fifth to give Creston a total of 6 points and runnerup place at the end of the Friday afternoon activities. Kohan of Union won second place but South added a total of 5 points on the jump when Schick took third and Stearns fourth.

Davis Tech was in third place after the two events were over, with 5 points. Union had 4, Central 2 and Catholic 1.

Miller enjoyed a good afternoon for he qualified in both hurdle events as well, equaling the 16.1 mark of Ward of South in the highs, which was the best qualifying time, and making a time that broke the city 200-yard low hurdle mark in doing that distance in 23.8. Ward, a favorite over Miller in advance predictions on both hurdles, ran in 24.3. The present city 200-yard hurdle mark is 23.9, by Amon of Union in 1935. Wind conditions were right for acceptance of records Friday but only two watches were held on Miller, and whether his time will be accepted officially as a record remains to be seen.

Sixteen Schools In.

South further increased its chances in the remaining finals to be contested Saturday afternoon by having the largest number of qualifiers in the four short distance races in which preliminary heats were run Friday. The Trojans
