Kalamazoo Wins 60-44; Pile Up Points In Sprints

Weakness in the dash proved the downfall of Benton Harbor high school's track team Saturday morning in its meet at Kalamazoo with Central high the final score being 60 to 44 in Central's favor. They took seven first places to Benton Harbor's five.

The Kalamazoo thirder sprint in the 100-yard dash, and took the first place in the 200 yard dash, being the same as their margin of victory for the entire meet. McKinney and Bulard finished one-two in both of these sprints.

The 800-yard run was also disastrous for the Tigers, as Loosa got only a third in a slowly run race. Perhaps the outstanding performance of the day was the 201 seconds low hurdle mark of Harold Taylor, Negro star of the Tigers. Taylor has only run only a few hurdles races this year, but each time he has run them he has sliced nearly a second off his time. With a little more practice he should be hard to beat.

Victor Hunt, veteran high hurdler, topped the event as expected, but Coach Jack Smith was pleasantly surprised to see Tirrell follow him to the tape in a close finish to give Benton Harbor a first and second.

Tirrell High Scorer

Tirrell garnered a first in the high jump and a second in the pole vault to be high scorer for the Tigers with 11 points. McKinney of Central was high point man for the meet with his 8 1/2 in the two sprints and a leg on winning relay team totaling 11 1/2 points.

Patterson took shot put honors with a heave of 41 feet 10 inches, with Bus taking second with a mark three inches behind.

Stovall's leap of 19 feet 2 inches in the broad jump gave him a fine place in the meet, with Polfus getting third.

Benton Harbor has no meets scheduled for this week, but Smith does not want to have his boys remain idle until the practice meet with St. Joseph May 11, and is going to try to arrange a meet with Buchanan or some other county school this week.

The combined regional and conference meet is only two short weeks away, and Smith wants his team to gain all the strength possible before that date.
