

Ron Mead Equals Mark in Century

East Lansing's Ron Mead shone above all city athletes competing in the interscholastic track and field meet at the new Michigan State college track Saturday.

Mead won both dash events in the Class B, tying the meet record twice in the century. He won both his preliminary heat and the finals in the time of :10.2. He breasted the t a p e ahead of the Class B field in the 220 in :22.5. East Lansing finished in third place in the team standings with 20 points. Wayne Lee, a Trojan, placed fourth in the 200-low hurdles. The Trojan relay team finished second.

Neither Eastern or Central had the team balance to make much of a showing. The Quakers earned eight points as the result of Louis Gray's first place in the mile, 4:37.1, and Bill Sikes' fifth place in the 880. Ted Tykocki was the only Central boy to win in the finals. He took first place in the broad jump with a leap of 22 feet 9 inches.
