

# Mt. Morris Teams, Fenton High Are Best in County Track Meet

Mt. Morris High school and Mt. Morris St. Mary boys track teams today began their third year of rule as champions in their respective divisions of the Genesee County league.

Each successfully defended honors won in 1935 and 1936 Friday afternoon at Dort field. Mt. Morris captured the Class C title, while St. Mary dominated Class D activities.

The only break in Mt. Morris' rule came in the girls' division, Fenton, under the direction of Coach Ellen Wicklund, winning the palm. Last year, Fenton damaged

good in Friday's meet, which was run under ideal weather conditions. New records were set in the shot, jump and broad jumps and the pole vault in Class C division. The shot and high and broad jump marks were also bettered in Class D and the pole vault mark was tied.

Mt. Morris showed exceptional strength in the high and low hurdles as well as the half mile in sweeping to victory in the Class C division. It placed one-two in each of these events. In all, Mt. Morris captured five of the 12 first places and raced second in six events. Clio gained four firsts and three seconds to make it close a part of the way.

## Wins Seven First Places

St. Mary's strength in Class D was best shown by the fact that the state champions captured seven of the 12 first places. Coach Vernard Gay's boys showed their greatest strength in the low hurdles and the relay.

Of the individual performers, Kotwicki of Mt. Morris was outstanding, taking firsts in the high and low hurdles and the shot. Clio dominated the sprints with Devillo Hodges placing first in the 100-yard event and Ken Loop in the 220. Loop also won the broad jump to make him the only other double winner in the Class C division.

Leland gave Mt. Morris a first in the half mile, while Arnold of Bendle took the mile and Berger of Bendle won the quarter. Herman of Fenton was credited with the new pole vault record of 10 feet 6 inches, while Salisbury set the new high jump standard of 5 feet 3 inches.

Ruegsegger of Montrose tossed the shot 37 feet 1 1/4 inches for a new Class D standard. Newman of St. Mary leaped 5 feet 1 inch for a high jump mark and Dimick of Montrose broad jumped 19 feet 3 3/4 inches for the new broad jump standard. Hazzard of Hoover equaled the pole vault record of 9 feet 3 inches.

## Black Cops Two Sprints

Black of St. Mary dominated the sprints with victories in the 100 and 220-yard events. Chapman gave St. Mary a first in the low hurdles while Goodall won the half, Martin the mile for other St. Mary's firsts.

Turner of Goodrich won the high hurdles and Mullett of Hoover placed first in the quarter.

Fenton's relay team, which gave it the girls' title, was composed of Weigant, Milliken, Brooks and Buckingham. Schultz won the hop-skip and jump and Thompson the basketball throw to aid Fenton's cause.

McDonald of Beecher scored firsts in the standing broad jump and 50-yard dash, while Foster a team mate, won the shot put. Brock of Mt. Morris won the softball throw.
