OSGOOD INJURED
As a result of injuries, Robert Osgood will be unable to report at the U. P. relay in Escanaba, according to a message received by Principal Edward E. Edrick of the Senior high school early this morning. Signed by J. J. Doherty, assistant track coach at Michigan, the telegram read as follows:

"Osgood injured, can not come. Townsend, shotput, discus thrower and basketball captain will come if you wish. Wire at once."

Mr. Edrick wired his approval immediately, and John F. Townsend is now expected to double with Sam Stoller in providing entertainment for track and field fans at the Upper Peninsula relay tomorrow afternoon.

Escanaba plays host Monday at the Tenth Annual Relay Carnival to two of the greatest college track athletes in the United States—Robert Osgood and Sam Stoller of the University of Michigan, and approximately 175 crack high school runners from every city and town in the Upper Peninsula. In addition, Southern Eastern high school's brilliant two mile relay team will compete as another special feature.

Following in the footsteps of former world famous college track men from Illinois, Marquette, Minnesota, Northwestern and Michigan State, Osgood and Stoller will give special exhibitions at the relay program which will start at 2 o'clock at the high school athletic field.

Stoller Are Stars

By virtue of his startling record smashing victory in the Big Ten high hurdles at Ann Arbor last Saturday, Osgood is rated as the latest hurdler in the world. Against some of the best competition in the country last week, Osgood stepped the 128 high hurdles in 14 seconds flat, two-tenths of a second faster than the accepted world record held by Peatry Board in 1931. Osgood's performance was all the more spectacular because his record was made on a soggy track in a rainstorm. Captain of the Michigan's championship team, Osgood is rated as one of the most popular athletes on the Wolverine campus. Stoller is known as the "Olympic Orphan" for having been a member of the United States Olympic team in Berlin last summer without getting an opportunity to run and as "Second Middle" for having trailed the great Jesse Owens in so many of his record smashing races. Stoller, this year, has come into his own and has been a consistent winner. Last Saturday, he topped the Big Ten 100 yard dash in 9.3 on a wet track. The accepted world's record is 9.4, set in 1930 by Frank Wykoff.
