

Cosmos Concentrate on 3 Races and Win

Hamtramck Scores 21 of 42 Points in 440, Half and Mile to Take 3rd Prep Track Title in Row

Floyd Stocum, Hamtramck High's track coach, was discussing the prospects of his team winning its third successive outdoor track championship the other day. "We'll win the meet if we can take 21 points in the quarter, half and the mile," he said. "Give us those points and the other events will take care of themselves."

Hamtramck scored exactly 21 points in the three races at U. of D. Stadium Friday. It added 21 more in the remaining 10 events, finishing with 42 points to 33 for Redford, the runner-up.

Behind the two leaders were Cooley, 22 points; Southeastern 18; Northwestern 6; Pershing 6; Cass 5; Denby 3; Northern 3; Central 3, and Southwestern 2. Hamtramck took only three firsts, while Redford was first in five events. The remaining first places were divided between Cooley with three, Cass one and Southeastern one.

SCORE IN 11 EVENTS

The defending title-holders scored in 11 of the 13 events, taking first and second in the 440, first and third in the mile, first and fourth in the half-mile, second and third in low hurdles, second in the 100-yard dash, second in the high jump, third in the high hurdles, fourth in the 220, third in the discus and second in the relay. They did not place in the broad jump or pole vault.

Redford took first and second in the 220, first and third in the 100, first in the pole vault, discus and relay, but took only two other places, third in the shot, and fourth in the broad jump.

Bob Abbott of Redford was the meet's only double winner, leading the field in the 100 and 220. He also ran anchor on the relay team and his strong finish enabled the Redford quartet to tie the meet record of 1:33 3-5, set by Central in 1934. No other marks were equaled or broken.

WINS BY INCHES

The closest race of the afternoon was the quarter mile in which Bob Wingo of Hamtramck passed his team-mate, Jim Bradford, in the last stride to win by inches.

There were several upsets. Alex Milne of Southwestern, the favorite, could place no better than fourth in the high jump, while Henry Jefferson of Southwestern, who turned in the fastest time in the preliminaries, was unplaced in the quarter. Dick Slevin of Cooley, given a chance to set a new record in the event, could clear no better than 10 feet 0 in the pole vault, placing fourth, while Al Thomas of Cooley was third in the high hurdles and unplaced in the 220 dash. He won the low hurdles. Bob McKenna of Redford whipped the two favorites, Jim Mead of Cooley and Walter Jurkiewicz of Hamtramck in the discus.

Jacobs Acts to Quiet Max

Plans to Give Him Shot at Title in September

NEW YORK, June 5. — (AP) — Unsuccessful in his effort to fight Jimmy Braddock for the heavy-weight championship two days ago, Max Schmeling probably will meet the winner of the Braddock - Joe Louis bout some time in September.

Promoter Mike Jacobs figures the bout is all but made and Max, while he says he hasn't agreed yet, appears likely to accept on the theory that it's the only way he can get a shot at the title.

Max announced late yesterday he would sail for Germany aboard the Hamburg at midnight tonight just about the same time that Jacobs admitted he was planning a Schmeling title bout, probably in September in a New York ball park. Trainer Max Machon said, "The bout is agreeable to us if Mike can swing it."

Schmeling himself hadn't heard of it, however, but there was a possibility he would have something to say before leaving tonight. While the German boxer was busy with his attorneys, Machon, a close personal friend, did most of the talking. "We want the title back," he said, "and that looks like the only way we can get it."
