## 2 Threaten the Cosmos

### Cooley and Redford Bid for Title

Fifteen schools have qualified athletes for the finals of the City scholastic track and field meet at U. of D. Stadium this afternoon, but only one, Hamtramck, defending champion, seems capable of scoring as much as 35 points.

Hamtramck, seeking its third successive outdoor title, has entries in 11 of the 13 events on today's program, missing out only in the pole vault and the broad jump. Figuring points on a conservative

basis the titleholders should score seven each in the quarter, half and one-mile runs, three each in the shot put and discus throws, two each in the relay and high hurdles and one each in the low hurdles, 220-yard dash, high jump and 100-yard dash.

There always are possibilities of upsets and Hamtramck may not score as many as seven points in any of the distance events, but this can be discounted by the fact that it should register more points than it is credited in the dashes, low hurdles and relays.

#### TWO TITLE THREATS

Redford and Cooley are the strongest contenders for Hamtramck's laurels but they must come through with unusually good performances to gain the same number of points as Hamtramck figures to score.

To have a chance for the title Redford must take first and second in both the 100 and 220-yard events, win the relay, place second in the broad jump, discus and shot and third in the pole vault, high and broad jumps.

Cooley must place one-two in the pole vaults, first in the shot, discus and both hurdles, second in the 220 and relay and fourth in the half-mile.

Final regular season ball games also are scheduled today. The Metropolitan League has nine games and the Catholic League seven.

#### SERIES POSTS AT STAKE

The fight for playoff berths still occupies the attention of five Metropolitan teams, Chadsey and Southwestern on the West Side and Southeastern, Northeastern and Denby on the East. Victories for Southeastern and Northeastern would eliminate Denby. Chadsey and Southwestern are tied for second on the West Side where Western, the leader, has clinched its place in the championship series. If both win today an extra game will be played next week to break the second place tie.

One Metropolitan contest was played Thursday, Central beating Cooley, 4 to 3. Bob Rioux held Central to four hits but two of them were bunched with an error, a walk and a hit batsman for three runs in the fourth. Byron Vafiada tripled and stole home for Central in the first.

Lourdes and Catholic Central, tied for the Catholic League's first division title for two years, meet at Ford Field in Highland Park with the division crown at stake.
