Parade of Events Opens with Central-Trojan Baseball Game Today

REDS WIN-TRACK MEET

Another week of diversified competition opening this afternoon with a baseball game between Central and East Lansing at West Side field confronted high school athletes Monday.

The spring sport parade, gradually accelerating its pace, will include track, tennis, golf, and baseball with three big days of activity.

There is a lull Tuesday but Wednesday Resurrection and Central come to grips at Marshall field. Central's golfers go to Portland and the unbeaten Eastern linksmen trek to Charlotte. East Lansing's trackmen have an engagement at Howell.

Saturday Busy Day

The Trojan neimen travel to Owosso Thursday for the only action scheduled that day. Friday Central and Jackson renew their long rivalry with a track meet here while Eastern's baseball team entertains Grand Ledge. East Lansing's golf team meets St. Johns here on the same day.

Four events are slated for Saturday. In golf Central meets Flint Central at Flint and Eastern matches strokes with Jackson here. Eastern plays host to Battle Creek in track and Central's net forces tackle Flint Central.
