

Runners Start Friday Bill at 4 P. M.; Shot and Jump Finals On

The race split wide open and the dope sheets upset Friday as the result of a decision by city league coaches Thursday afternoon to include an extra heat each in the 440 and 880-yard events, 200 of the city's class A prep trackmen awaited the Friday afternoon regional meet preliminaries at Houseman field as the prelude to the finals of Saturday when the crowns will be decided in classes A, B, C and D. Three heats will now be run in the 440 instead of two and two in the 880 instead of one.

The addition of the heats threw an extra 18 points into the arena but at the same time automatically assured the city schools of two extra representatives in each event in the state finals at Michigan State college next week.

Start at 4 P. M.

Heat and lane drawings completed Thursday afternoon at the Houseman field house where city coaches assembled, Friday afternoon's preliminaries were to get off at 4 p. m. At the same time, two finals events were to be run off in the shot put and the high jump.

First on schedule, the high hurdlers will take off over the sticks at 4 o'clock in a three-heat session, the first two in each heat to qualify for Saturday's final in the event.

Following the high hurdles the shot and high jump will be run off together with preliminaries in the broad jump. At 4:30 the cream of the dash crop will line up for the 100-yard sprint, three heats scheduled; at 4:45 the low hurdlers will vie over the 200-yard course and the preliminaries will be wound up at 5 o'clock with the 220-yard dashmen competing in a three-heat burst.
