

Bates Cracks Three Marks

Bloomfield Hills Wins Class D Title

EAST LANSING, May 28.—Eighteen Eastern High School boys set First Central for the Michigan High School Class A track and field championship today by taking second place in the final event of the meet, the 100-yard dash.

The final score was: Hagano 20.5; Grand Rapids South, 22; and Florence, 23.

New champions were crowned in every class. The silver team captures three: Class B—Holding; Class C—Alger; and Class D—Bloomfield Hills. Individual star of the entire meet was Fayette, First Central North, who smashed three state records. His time of 22.4 seconds in the 200-yard low hurdles was disallowed, however, because of a favored wind.

Better War's Record

Bates ran the 120-yard high hurdles in 15 seconds flat, romping through the old mark of 16.2 set by Campbell, of Monroe, in 1937. His third record was 4 feet 2 1/2 inches in the high jump, equalling the old 4 feet 4 inches mark set by Villa Wren, of Detroit. Northwestern, one week high.

Holding edged out East Lansing, 23 to 20, for the Class B championship despite a record-breaking 20

mark of 1 minute, 22.8 seconds set by the East Lansing who won today team. Buchanan was first and Birmingham fourth.

Quinn Dowdell, of Birmingham, turned in one of the best individual performances of the meet when he ran the half mile in 1:17.1 to better the team record of 1:58.8 set by Quinn, of Lansing, in 1937.

Alger Wins Class C

Alger won an easy victory in Class C, piling up 42 points to finish far ahead of its nearest rival, Charlevoix, which had 19 1/2. East Grand Rapids, Two Four and Howell were tied for third with 10 points each.

In Class D, Bloomfield Hills edged ahead of last year's victor, St. Morris St. Mary's, by a score of 25 to 24. Nathan was shot with 10 points and St. Mary's was fourth with 17.

Robert Hall, of Bloomfield Hills, clipped three seconds off the old state mark in the 120-yard high hurdles to make a complete overthrow of marks in that event.

Quinn Cheng, of the same school, set the new hurdles record from 100 yards in 22.4. The Class D mile run was raced in 4:43.5 by John Ettinger, of St. Luke, more than three seconds under the old mark.

Eight hundred yards from Fayette finished yesterday from 270 yards high school, representing 17 state high schools, set 13 state records, triple and two had broken other records were equalled by a strong wind.
