

Saginaw East Winner Of State Track Crown

EAST LANSING, May 28.—Four new champions—Saginaw Eastern in Class A, Belding in Class B, Algonac in Class C and Bloomfield Hills in Class D—tonight rule state interscholastic track circles.

In one of the closest finishes in the 32-year history of the meet, Saginaw's entry nipped Flint Central by one and one-tenth points as Monroe, the defending champion, finished well back in the field. Saginaw scored 313.5 points to Flint Central's 30½.

Only a single point separated the first and second place teams in Class B, Belding nosing out East Lansing, 29-28. Birmingham, the 1937 winner in the class, could do no better than fourth, trailing behind Buchanan, which was third.

Algonac romped off with its crown by piling up 42 points, more than twice the total of its nearest rival. Buried deep among the team scorers was Okemos, last year's winner.

A battle also marked the competition in Class D. Bloomfield Hills annexing the title with 35 points. St. Mary's of Mt. Morris, the defending champion and favorite, finished a point behind in second.

Thirteen new state records were hung up during the day. Floyd Bates of Flint Central accounted for two of the marks in Class A as he leaped 6 feet 2 7/8 inches in the high jump and broke the tape in 15.1 seconds, in the high hurdles. Charles Schmeling of Saginaw Eastern speeded to a new 440-yard record of 50.5 seconds.

In Class B Ron Mead of East Lansing bettered the 220-yard record with a performance of 21.9 seconds; Carl Henry of Belding broke the high hurdle standard by running 15.4 seconds; Quentin Belsford of Birmingham erased the half-mile mark in 1:57.6 and East Lansing's relay set a new mark of 1:32.5.

Don Turnipseed of Mancelona, in the high hurdles; Clinton Melvin, Fowlerville, in the mile; Elwood Housler, Boyne City, in the quarter, and Vince Butler, Howard City, shattered records in Class C.

Two Bloomfield Hills entries, Gordon Craig and Bob Halls, established new records in the low and high hurdles, respectively. John Eldridge of Bear Lake topped the mile record in the class.
