Algónac, Bloomfield Keep Their Titles in Classes C, D

By GEORGE MASKIN EAST LANSING, May 27.—Two repeat champions and a pair of new titlists emerged at the head of the battling here today in the thirty-third annual state interscholastic track and field meet on the Michigan State College track.

Successful in the retention of their 1938 laurels were Algonac in Class C, and Bloomfield Hills in Class D. Meantime, River Rouge came off with its first Class A title, while St. Joseph topped the proceedings in Class B.

The victory of River Rouge marks the return of the "A" pennant to the Metropolitan Detroit area for the first time since 1930. In that year, the last time Detroit schools vied in State competition, Northwestern annexed the chaminorship Saginaw Far Back

In winning today, the Panthers garnered 34½ points to outclass the rest of the field. Lansing Central wound up second with 26, as Saginaw, the defending champion, lagged far behind with 8½.

River Rouge produced only two individual champions, Paul White in the high hurdles and Otis Wade in the high jump. Lowell Healey of the Panthers broke into the scoring column in three events by placing third in the broad jump, fourth in the 220-yard dash and fifth in the Century.
