## BIG RED TRACKERS SECOND IN CLASS A

Central Scores 26 Points Against River Rouge's 34 1/2 in State Meet

### TROJANS PLACE FOURTH

Algona and Bloomfield Hills, in Classes C and D, respectively, successfully defended titles yesterday as school boy track and field athletes swarmed and clashed over the Michigan State college track in their annual lower peninsula meet. River Rouge in Class A and St. Joseph in Class B were the other divisional winners. Rain soaked athletes and spectators several times during the afternoon.

Lansing Central's 5-A championship team made a heroic bid for honors in Class A but bowed to River Rouge team balance. The Big Reds valiantly fought their way into runner-up honors, 24 1/2 to 26.

Don Lansing's team that was second last year and rated a strong contender this season, could do no better than fourth in the "B" field that witnessed a wild scramble. St. Joseph finished on top by one-half point, scoring 25 to Niles' 24 1/2. Kalamazoo State high leaped out the Trojans, 21 to 20. Inability to get into the scoring in the mile run cost the Trojans some points.

### Quakers Are Eighth

It was the first trip to the throne for River Rouge. St. Joseph was champion in 1932 and it was Algona's third victory in eight years, having won also in 1931.

Lansing Eastern finished in eighth place with 11 points, all by Dale Kaulitz and Lansing School for the Blind was in the Class D running, finishing fourth with 17 points.

Gordon Craig was the River Rouge team's star. Craig won both hurdles and the broad jump and ran on the relay team for 19 1/2 points, more than half his team's total. The other individual that stood out in the meet was Ednat Lansing's Ron Mend, who accounted for his sixth championship in three years. The sturdy Trojan sprinter won both the 100- and 200-yard dashes just as he did in 1937 and 1938.

His feat of running the 100-yard dash in the time of .29.8 was hailed as the best performance of the day but he was robbed of a record when officials ruled a following wind was in excess of the standard. Mend probably would have broken 10 seconds under almost any conditions, the way he was running Saturday.

### Kaulitz and Davis Win

Only two records were broken. James Navaux of Monroe vaulted 12 feet 4 1/2 inches to set up a new mark and Dan Sullivan of Wayne pushed the 12-pound shot out 23 feet 9 1/2 inches to improve the mark in Class B. The wind at the backs of the sprinters and hurdlers nullified other records.

ST. LOUIS, May 27 (AP)—The rampaging Cincinnati Reds showed their heels to the St. Louis Cardinals again Saturday, dunting them off, 3 to 2, before a cloudless, broke up the game after eight innings.

Play could not be resumed after a 30-minute delay and the Redlegs rained up their tenth successive victory and increased their grip on first place in the spirited National League race to nearly two full games over the Cardinals.
