

# Burgess Lawson Wins Event for Ottawa Hills

## Other Local Entries Fail to Make Impression; Maier of South Edges Into 100

East Lansing—Under lowering skies that promised rain, the Michigan State High School Athletic association's thirty-third annual championship track and field meet was being run off Saturday on the Michigan State college field. Of Grand Rapids' delegation of 37 track and field artists who qualified for the meet, Burgess Lawson of Ottawa Hills was outstanding in the early stages as he tossed the shot 50 feet, 5 1/4 inches for first place in the class A final. His victory gave the Indian delegation six points to start off the day.

### Maier Gets In.

Other Grand Rapids athletes failed to make any impressive showing in the morning preliminaries, Maier of South barely edging into the 100-yard dash finals. Furniture city hurdlers were edged out, both in the 120 and 200 yard sticks.

Peterson of East qualified for the class C high sticks but the majority of laurels were reserved to western Michigan schools who crowded into the qualifying lists in the B, C and D classes with preponderantly heavy representations.

Besides making the 120 high hurdles, Arndt of Ionia also tied for fifth and sixth places in the pole vault. Conner of Allegan, a reliable performer, made the grade in the class B 120 sticks and also qualified for the finals in the 200-yard timbers. Witte of Fremont duplicated the feat in the same class. Turnipseed of Mancelona was the outstanding star of the trials, however. He ran to successive victories in both the 120 and 220 yard hurdle qualifying heats, tying the state record in the shorter distance and also equaling the mark in the low barriers. His times of 15.6 and 23.8 were the fastest in the class.

Derby of Fremont, Nelson of White Cloud, Lillie of Coopersville and Holton of Grant were other leading candidates in the speed and dash events. Price of Belding tied for first in the pole vault, while Velding of Wyoming Park made a tie for fourth in the class C high jump. Nash of Big Rapids took a fifth in the class B broadjump. Alward of Traverse City, running in the class B low hurdles, also gave spectators something to think about when he hit a 23.3 clip, two-tenths of a second under the state record.

### Local Hurdlers Out.

The meet opened un auspiciously for Grand Rapids schools in the first event of the day when the 120-yard high hurdles trials failed to show any local boys in the qualifying list. Ide of Ottawa, Calkins of Central and Smitter of South were nosed out in stiff competition.

In the class B event, four western Michigan timber toppers stuck in for the finals. Arndt of Ionia ran second in a 16 flat heat with Zoll of Allegan fourth in the same canto. Witte of Fremont also stepped out for a second place in the qualifying trials and Conner of Allegan pulled up third. Munn of Mt. Pleasant stuck in for a narrow fourth. The class D event was held over for finals in the afternoon because only nine men were entered, Graham of Pentwater and Janes of Fruitport were listed as competitors.

Beckman of Shelby took first in the class C 120 high trials with a time of 16.3 and Goss of Charlevoix pulled in third. Turnipseed of Mancelona, however, stepped off the same sticks in 15.6, tying the state record in the event and was pushed hard by Peterson, East Grand Rapids' lanky entry. Brandt of Paw Paw edged in the list with a fourth.

### South Sprinter In.

In the class A 100-yard dash, Kruger of Ottawa Hills failed to meet the challenge of a 9.9 time set by Rayford of Muskegon and in the second class A heat McCarger of Owosso pulled in first with a sprint of 10 flat. Maier of South was third, the first Grand Rapids boy to qualify in the morning trials. Atman of Ottawa was fifth, but out of the running.

The class B century dash saw Derby of Fremont fourth in a fast field, Rahn of St. Joseph hitting a 10.3 pace, one-tenth second under the record. Mead of East Lansing, co-record holder, won the second heat in 9.9. The time was disallowed because of a tail wind.

Nelson, the White Cloud flyer, copped the class C hundred-sprint in the first heat with a time of 10.4. Lillie of Coopersville took a second in the following heat with Holton of Grant in third place. Emery of Whitehall qualified also with a second in the next heat and Steinberg of Frankfort remained in the running for the finale with a third place.

### Fruitport Lad Leads.

Hansen of Fruitport qualified with a 10.6 gallop in the class D century, the only western Michigan boy to make the afternoon test.

A 22.5 flight over the 200-yard low sticks in class A was won by Kaultitz of Lansing Eastern, four-tenths under the record. The time was disallowed because of a stiff tail wind. Moll of South and Calkins of Central and Lindbloom

## Kyle Takes Golf Title

### Scotchman Comes From Behind to Nose Out Welshman

Hoylake, England — (U.P.) — Alex Kyle, a Scotchman, won the British amateur golf championship Saturday by defeating Anthony Duncan of Wales, 2 and 1, in a 36-hole match.

Duncan was 2 up at the end of the morning round of 18 holes, but in the afternoon Kyle went out and whittled him down. Thus the title that Charley Yates of Atlanta won last year returned to Great Britain. The last American survivor in this year's tournament was Bill Holt, Syracuse, N. Y., who was eliminated Friday.

In the B 200-sticks, Bruce of Charlotte and Conner of Allegan came in second and third while Alward of Traverse City stepped out to win the second heat, hard pushed by Witte of Fremont. Alward's time was 23.3, two-tenths of a second under the state record for the flight. Too much wind disqualified the time for record consideration.

Beckman, the Shelby ace, copped the first heat in the class C timbers, and in the second heat, Haney of Comstock Park ran second to Turnipseed, the Mancelona flash, who copped first. Turnipseed stepped over the barriers in 23.8, tying a 4-year-old state record, thus qualifying for both high and low flights.

Peterson of East Grand Rapids failed to place in the heat. Bailey of Mason was a third in the third heat.

Maier of South put an extra burst of speed to qualify for the 220-yard dash finals, by fourth place in his heat. Atman of Ottawa failed to make the second-heat grade. Times for the heats were 22.1 and 21.5 respectively.

Schultz of Hastings, Derby of Fremont and Gardner of Traverse City qualified for the 220-dash finals in class B and Holton of Grant and Plumhoff, Shelby, were two class C dash men who also made the finals in their class. Steinberg of Frankfort, Lillie of Coopersville and Benedict of Paw Paw and Emery of Whitehall also qualified.
