Three new Genesee county track and field records were hung up and a fourth one equaled Friday afternoon as Mt. Morris, Beecher, Mt. Morris St. Mary and Goodrich carried off team honors in the annual county meet at Dort field. Goodrich became the first school

to win the girls' Class C title as this was the first year that the girls were divided into classes. They won the trophy with 46 points.

The two Mt. Morris schools again dominated the boys' events in both classes. Mt. Morris High school took its fourth straight Class B championship with 43 points and Mt. Morris St. Mary repeated last year's victory by amassing a total of 76½ points.

In the girls' Class B competition Beecher won the title by running away from the field with 50 points.

### First Record to Fall

Janet Dobbs of Fenton started the assault on the record books by heaving the shot put 32 feet 2¾

inches, breaking the old Class B mark by 1 foot 8¾ inches.

Two Hoover boys then wiped out Class C records in the mile and 880-yard run. Harold Flynn was clocked in 5:02 in the mile, clipping one-tenth of a second from the standard set last year, and Max Whitetree finished the 880 in 2:08.3. The old mark in this event was 2:09.7.

Vito DeNicolò, Mt. Morris St. Mary, tied the Class C 120-yard high hurdle record of :18.9.

Medals for individual performances were awarded to Ralph Barlow, Hoover; Warren Hart, Mt. Morris; Helen Dobbs, Beecher; and Betty Murphy, Mt. Morris St. Mary.

### Barlow, Hart Shine

Barlow turned in the day's best performance by taking firsts in the Class C high jump and pole vault, second in the 120-yard high hurdles and third in the 100-yard dash for a total of 17 points.

Hart took more first places than anyone in the meet while accounting for 15½ points in Class B. He paced the field in the 220-yard low hurdles, 120-yard high hurdles and pole vault. He also ran on the fourth place 880-yard relay team.

Miss Murphy led the scoring in the girls' Class C by winning the shot put and hop-step-jump events and placing fourth in the baseball throw for a 12 point total, ¾ of a point ahead of Mary Frances Burns, also of St. Mary. Helen Dobbs had 10 points in Class B with first places in the broad jump and baseball throw.

## Contracts for 24 Warships Issued

### Two Super-Battlewagons Are Included

Washington — INS — The navy acted Friday to transform America's great naval rearmament program from paper to steel, awarding contracts for 24 new warships to cost \$350,000,000—two 45,000-ton super-battlewagons, greatest ever built for this country, included.

The contract awards were made with unusual speed after passage of the record-breaking \$773,000,000 naval appropriations bill and its signing by President Roosevelt. The navy told Congress it was ready to go at once on the mammoth construction program.
