

Lead Is Taken by Jungaleers

Cosmo Track Squad Trails by Point

Ray Anderson, a high jumper, and Bill Bell, a half miler, came through with impressive victories Tuesday afternoon to give Southeastern High School's track team 10 points and a one-point lead over the field as the East Side meet got under way at Denby.

Anderson cleared 5 feet 11 inches to take the high jump, while Bell took the 880-yard run in 2:08.5. Anderson had not jumped higher than 5 feet 8 inches before Tuesday.

Hamtramck, with Paul Bagnowski winning the quarter mile, scored nine points in the three events completed Tuesday to keep in the running for the East Side title. Bagnowski stepped the 440 in :54.8 to beat Joe Slivik, of Denby. Slivik was clocked in :55.6 for second place.

Other team scores are Miller 8, Denby 7, Cass Tech 5, Northern 3, Eastern 2 and Pershing 1.

All other East Side finals will be completed Thursday at Denby. The West Side meet will be completed Wednesday at Cooley.

A peculiar thing happened in the 30-yard low hurdle preliminaries. In the first preliminaries three Southwestern boys, Dan Evashenko, Jim Cox and Louis Schmidt, stepped the 30-yard low timbers in :04 flat to unofficially tie the City record. Then Evashenko and Schmidt failed to qualify for the finals, and Cox barely squeezed through as he finished second in the semifinal heat.
