

**East Side Title
in Track Kept
by Jungaleers**

Southeastern retained its East Side high-school track championship Thursday afternoon in the finals at Denby, but that wasn't the big track news of the day.

Eddie Soloman, an all-round performer from Northern, supplied the meet with the big excitement when he won three first places and finished the day with a sixteen-point total to overshadow the other performers as much as Hitler overshadows Goebbels.

Soloman won the low and high hurdles and the thirty-yard dash. Then he ran a leg on the Northern relay team which placed second to Hamtramck. To make the day a howling success, the Northern ace was clocked in 0:03.9 in the thirty-yard low timbers, one-tenth of a second below the recognized city record. However, this mark is not official because the league recognizes only the times made in the city semifinals and finals.

Southeastern retained its team title with a forty-two-point total, although only one Jungaleer, Bob Phipps in the mile, won a first place in the events held Thursday. Phipps was clocked in 4:43.7.

Because of the great performance of Soloman and a couple of good races by Leonard Alkon, Northern finished in a tie for second place with Hamtramck at 31 points. Other team scores were Cass, 16; Miller, 9½; Denby, 8½; Eastern, 8; Pershing, 3, and Northeastern, 1.

Soloman was the only boy in the meet to win more than one first place. He nosed out Alkon in the thirty-yard dash and beat Cox, of Southeastern, in both the low and high hurdles.

Alkon won the 220-yard dash in 0:24.9, but some luck was involved in this victory. Alkon raced against Conner in his heat. Conner, favored to win the event, slipped on a turn on the second lap and finished unplaced.

The only other individual victory in Thursday's events was registered by Ed Baron, of Hamtramck. Baron cleared 10 feet 9 inches to win the pole vault.
