Break Marks**

**Six Records Fall  
in A.A.U. Meet**

KALAMAZOO, June 1.—Consistent scoring in 14 of the 20 events enabled Michigan Normal to run away with the seventeenth annual outdoor Michigan Amateur Athletic Union track and field championships held today at Waldo Stadium.

Normal counted five firsts in rolling up 121½ points to dethrone Michigan State as team titlist. The Detroit Police, second last year, were second again today in the weight events. University of Michigan was next with 70 points while Michigan State squad took fourth with 59½ points. Some of State's stars did not compete here, being in the East for the I.C.A. meet.

**Six Marks Set**

The day's competition by the field of 275 athletes, largest ever to enter a State A.A.U. track meet, produced six records. Three other performances bettered existing marks but were disallowed because a strong tail wind favored the runners.

The record breakers included: Clark Haskins, of the Detroit Police, who tossed the 56-pound weight 34 feet 6¾ inches to break by three-and-three-quarter inches a record he set in 1937.

Harry Vannortwick, also of the Detroit Police, who threw the hammer 162 feet 2 inches to break the mark of 161 feet 4½ inches set in 1935 by George Huber, another Detroit policeman. Huber was second today.

Tom Quinn, of Michigan Normal, who ran the two mile in 9:28.2. The old record of 9:30.7 was established by Walter Stone, of Michigan, in 1938.

**Breidenbach Mark Falls**

Jack Leutritz, of Michigan, who covered the quarter mile in 48.9. He broke a record of 49.2 set in 1938 by Warren Breidenbach, another Wolverine. Breidenbach, Western Conference 440-yard champion, did not compete in the quarter today, running the sprints instead.

Al Mangan, of Michigan State, who stepped the two-mile walk in 15:15.6, 21 seconds better than the mark established in 1927 by Charles Foster, of the Detroit Y.M.C.A.

Leutritz, Jack Dobson, Phil Balyent and Breidenbach, of Michigan, who ran a 3:20 mile relay. Western State set the former record of 3:22.8 in 1938.
