CITY CHAMPIONS 1941

Central's 1941 Track team had an exceedingly fine season, winning all their scheduled meets, winning the regions, and placing seventh in the state contest.

The state meet provided keen competition for the Tribe, but through the combined efforts of the season's stars, John Thompson, Auldin Nelson, Hank Clark, Steve Le Porte, and Rutilio Enzastiga, they came through for a 14½-point seventh-place berth for Coach Francis Smith's training efforts.

So far in the 1942 season Central has met Northern but once. In this meet the

Tribe broke three city records and also broke the Dort Field shot put record.

Hank Clark shattered the former city mark for the half-mile event by making it in 2:02.3. Central placed first, second, and third in this event. The final score was Northern 67, Central 37.

Indian Thinclads defeated Saginaw 55½ to 48½ in spite of Saginaw's slams in the 100-yard dash and pole vault. Central slammed in the ½-mile and took first and second in the mile, both hurdles and the high jump.

The Regionals at Owosso and the State meet were uncertain quantities.
