

JHS 3rd in 5-A's Meet

Horace Smith Hangs Up Two Records.

Ann Arbor. — (Special)— Jackson High school finished third in the joint Five-A league-regional track meet Saturday on Ferry field, scoring 40 1-2 points. Ann Arbor won the title with 64 3-4, with Battle Creek second with 44. Lansing Central was fourth with 23 1-2 and Lansing Eastern last with 10 1-4.

Jackson qualified four boys for the state meet next week, two of them sophomores, Horace Smith and Leo Chmielewski.

Smith was his usual brilliant self Saturday, winning two first places and a second and establishing two new records. He copped the 100-yard dash in 10.1 seconds, to lower the record of 10.2 set by Ketchum of Battle Creek last year. He set a new mark of 14.8 in the 120-yard high hurdles, bettering the mark of 15.6 set by Thomas of Jackson in 1938.

Smith wasn't at his best in the high jump and was second with a leap of 5 feet 9 1-4 inches as Rich of Battle Creek took first with a jump of 5 feet 10 1-4 to break his own record set last year.

Paul Seibold and Leo Chmielewski ran second and third respectively in the 200-yard low hurdles to qualify for the state meet. Seibold was fifth in the 120-yard high hurdles.

Don DeMay gave Jackson a first place in the broad jump with a jump of 19 feet 11 3-4 inches and he surprised even more by high jumping 5 feet 8 inches to get a tie for third place.

Art Adams was fourth in the mile for Jackson, Jim DeMond fifth in the shotput, Earl Weatherly and Willard Cooley tied for fifth in the pole vault and the Jackson relay team finished third.
