

Track Title Shifts Hands in Class A

EAST LANSING—Paced by its great Negro sprinter, Bert Copeland, Benton Harbor won the Class A title in the Lower Peninsula track and field meet today. Battle Creek, the defending champion, finished twelfth with seven and a half points.

Scoring 30 points, the Tigers registered a clean sweep of Michigan scholastic laurels this year. The Benton Harbor football team went undefeated last fall and the basketball team won the state Class A crown.

East Lansing retained its Class B title, scoring 35 points to nose out Three Rivers, second with 32½.

St. Clair Shores South Lake off with the Class C championship, amassing 43 points. Second-place Imlay City had 24.

Bath was dethroned in Class D by Bear Lake, which counted 31½ points against the defending champion's 30 and 29½ for White Pigeon.

Copeland steered Benton Harbor to victory almost single-handedly, scoring 19½ points as he whisked off with the 100 and 220-yard dashes, won the broad
