Skeet Mark Shattered In Motor State Open

One new state skeet mark for a two-man 20-gauge gun team emerged Saturday from squalls of battle-like firing in the Motor State Open championship events at L. A. Young Gun Club, Nine-Mile and Southfield roads. Paul Slack and Dwight P. Allen gleaned 199 from a possible 200.

Contestants believed the Slack-Allen feat was a world's standard. Henry B. Joy Jr. and Richard Hecker were the former state record holders. Ralph Meli and F. C. Anderson werer unersup to Slack-Allen with 197.

Allen tied with Don Sperry of Flint in Class AA 20-gauge

singles at 100. Allen made one more hit than Sperry on the extra targets permitted to end the dead-lock, 25-24. Such pinch shooting brought Allen the title of champion in the class and left Sperry in first place.

James Anderson of Chicago and Slack tied for second at 99 each. Anderson defeated Slack in the "overtime period," 24 to 22, and gained second.

Tom Metzger of Greenville and James Anderson of Chicago each had 97 at the finish of the small-bore, 28-gauge event. Metzger took 23 and Anderson, 22 to break the tie. W. A. Brown was second. Brown scored 96 and outshot Hecker, 23 to 21, in the extra targets.
