

Kalamazoo Central Is Class A Winner

Birmingham Scores 33 1/2 Points to Top Class B Field; Inlay City and Bear Lake Triumph in C and D Respectively

Tradition was upheld at the lower pentstada track and field championships of the Michigan High School Athletic association held at East Lansing yesterday afternoon. New champions were crowned in all four classes, a procedure that annually prevails in closely contested meets.

Kalamazoo Central with blonde Bob Rogers showing the way succeeded Benton Harbor as the Class A kings with a total of 52 points. Tied for second place were Flint Central and Grand Rapids Union while

Flint Northern was only a fraction behind this pair with 21 1/2. East Lansing, defending champion in Class B, fell by the wayside with the rest of the champions. The total scores of the class are given by Birmingham today after scoring 33 1/2 points. Three teams were tied with 20 Benton Harbor, the "A" winner a year ago.

Flint scored only 3 points East Lansing did a lot better than that, having 8 1/2 for 19th place. The runner-up scored for five of the 10 items total by taking second place in the broad jump with a leap of 20 feet 8 1/2 inches. Carl Wood finished sixth in the half-mile after setting for more than 300 yards.

There were changing victories in Class C and D in the letter trials. City placed up 40-2-3 points and a Class D Bear Lake was just a fraction off that pace with a winning total of 40.

Rogers, the Kalamazoo sprint star, shared individual honors with Bill Swenson of Birmingham. Each won two events and were members of winning relay teams for totals of 21 points each.

There were only five records broken at day. A cool wind that blew in the face of the dash and hurdle men kept the performers at normal levels on most instances. Only one mark in Class A to fall was the pole vault. Forrest Stevens of Monroe

scored 17 points to place sixth in the 24 team field.

Husky Bob Mosher showed the way by grinding out a 33-foot win in the 440-yard dash. It was the first time that a North Point street athlete had won a first place in a state track meet.
