Fraser Tops Track Tests

Paces Three Events in YMCA Meet

Bob Fraser, who expects to be called for military duty when he is graduated from Mackenzie High in June, was the outstanding performer in the Metropolitan YMCA's West Side track trials at Cooley last night. The 18-year old Mackenzie student had the best times in three events, the 220-yard dash and the 30-yard high and low hurdles.

Fraser's time in the 220-yard dash was 25.5 seconds, two-tenths faster than that made by Dave Jaska, Cooley High student. They ran in separate heats.

All Detroit high school athletes competed unattached, with Cooley students leading the qualifiers for the finals next Friday, April 9, at the Police gymnasium.

Contestants from Birmingham, Ferndale and Ann Arbor high schools also took part in the qualifying in the shot put, pole vault, high hurdles and half-mile.

Besides the events for boys under 19 years old, the Police meet next week also will have a full program of senior events sanctioned by the Michigan AAU.
