

Grand Blanc Cops Its First Track Title; Beecher Girls Win

For the first time since it went all out for track over seven years ago, Grand Blanc High School has won a county track meet. Running and jumping amidst rain and through mud, the Orange and Black thinclads piled up 59½ points to win the Genesee County Class B Track Meet Tuesday evening at Grand Blanc.

Fenton, defending champion, took the runnerup position with 39½ points and was closely followed by Flushing with 37½ points. Mt. Morris and Beecher got 17 markers apiece, Clio 13½ and Bendle 2.

Beecher came through with another strong girls' team and succeeded in retaining its Class B crown with five firsts in six events, amassing 37 points. The Flushing girls were second with 17½, Grand Blanc had 13½. Davison 13 and Fenton 9.

Jack Galloway sparked the Grand Blanc attack with 14½ points but was second to Beecher's Bob Mayo for the individual scoring honors. Bob took first in the broad jump and placed in three other events to

total 16 points. Galloway won the high hurdles and would have won the lows had he not tripped on one of the hurdles and fell. He placed second.

Ronnie Schofield of Mt. Morris excelled in both of the sprints while Leslie Maxfield and John Gundry of Grand Blanc took firsts in the divided 440 and 880, respectively. Flushing won the other two heats as Herth DeMeritt copped the 440 and Francis Smith won the 880.
