

Jungaleers Seek to Hold Track Title

**Southeastern Squad
Will Be Shooting for
Third Crown in Row
Today at U-D Stadium**

Coach Leighton Boyd's Southeastern track team will be shooting for its third consecutive City League outdoor track title Wednesday when the finals of the annual carnival are held at University of Detroit Stadium, beginning at 2:30 p. m.

As usual, the Jungaleers will receive most of their competition from the Cooley High School squad, which placed 27 boys in the finals. Claude Snarey's team scored only three first places in the West Side meet, but more than doubled the second place team's score by posting 157 points on the strength of seconds and thirds.

The Jungaleers will be banking on Tally Spilos, who scored 24 points in the East Side meet, and Dave Bernard, who had 22½ points. Spilos won the pole vault and placed second and third in the high and low hurdles, respectively. Bernard won the 100 and 220-yard dash and ran a leg on the winning relay team.

All told, the Southeastern team won six first places in the East Side meet. Harry Wickersham taking the shot-put, Gilmore Dalrymple the mile run in addition to Spilos and Bernard's contributions the Jungaleers have 16 in the finals.

Some chance of winning the title must be given to Redford, Mackenzie and Pershing. Redford had four winners in the West Side meet when Joe Metz captured the 880, Dick Brown on the shotput, Fred Stolliker the mile and Tom Clark finished first in the broad jump.

From the results of the East and West Side meets, the West Side teams should be favored to take most first places. The times turned in during the West Side meet were much better than those chalked up by the East Siders.
