

Arthur Hill High Wins Track Meet

Ann Arbor, Mich., April 15—Although muscular Garion Campbell of Monroe galloped to three firsts, the team title in the fifth annual River Rouge invitational indoor track high school meet here Saturday night went to Saginaw Arthur Hill's well-balanced squad with 37 $\frac{1}{2}$ points.

Arthur Hill, winner of the state class A basketball crown, took only one first in the 11 events but that was the sole record-breaking performance of the meet—a six and one-quarter inch high jump by George Osborn. The old meet record was five feet, 11 $\frac{3}{8}$ inches established in 1941.

Second place went to Pontiac with 22 $\frac{1}{4}$ points, while Ann Arbor and Ferndale tied for third with 22 points each. Monroe was fifth with 20 $\frac{3}{4}$ points. In all, 20 schools broke into the scoring column.

Campbell, a smooth-striding Negro, who expects to enter the navy this year, romped to victories in the 65 yard low and high hurdles and 60 yard dash. In both hurdle events, the Monroe star beat out Dick Rifenburg, Saginaw Hill's basketball hero.

Arthur Hill piled up its winning total by grabbing five seconds in addition to Osborn's record breaking high jump. Versatile Rifenburg also placed second in the shot put.

Other runners-up included: Battle Creek, sixth, 19 $\frac{1}{2}$ points; Saginaw Eastern, seventh, 16 $\frac{1}{2}$; Wyandotte, eighth, 11 $\frac{1}{2}$; Ypsilanti Central, ninth, 10; Dearborn, tenth, eight; Royal Oak, eleventh, seven; Lansing Eastern, twelfth, six; River Rouge, thirteenth, 5 $\frac{3}{4}$; Flint Northern, fourteenth, five; and Birmingham, fifteenth, four.
