

### Cooley Grabs Meet Honors

#### Scores 102 1/3 Points in West Side Event

Cooley High School's track team made the first half of the West Side indoor track meet something of an intramural affair Tuesday afternoon when the Cardinals piled up 102 1/3 of a possible 156 points in five events.

In running up the imposing figure the Cardinal runners put 17 boys into the City League finals which will be held next week; won three of the five events, including a record-tying performance in the high hurdles where Cooley runners finished one-two-three-four.

Ted Balogh tied the City League record for the 30-yard high hurdles when he was chased the distance in four and one-fifth seconds. He was followed at the finish by Doug Simpson, Bill Marcoux and Al Noble, all teammates.

**EMMONS, SMITH WINNERS**

Howie Emmons and Hal Smith were the other Cardinal winners. Smith taking the mile and Emmons the 220-yard dash. In both of these races Cardinals were all jammed up in the first three places.

Smith toured the mile in 4:47.5, better than the winner's time on the East Side by nearly 11 seconds. He was trailed by Clark Jacob and Gene Beeman in second and third place, and Hank Cannon, who finished sixth.

In the 220 Emmons turned in the fastest time of :25.5, with Wes Reynolds taking second place, and Art Gibson, of Cooley, also tying Don Huff for third.

**HUSKIES ARE SECOND**

Redford took second place in the first day's events, mainly through the efforts of Joe Metz, stellar half-miler, who won that title in easy fashion, taking 2:06.7 for the 880 yards. Cooley scored here, too, however, picking up a second by John Jenks, a third by Frank Dyson, a fifth place by Jim Morakus and a sixth by Dave Bradbury.

Even in the high jump, where Coach Claude Snarey, of Cooley, asserts the Cardinals have no strength, the leaders picked up points when Odell Mercer tied Bob Burrell, of Mackenzie, for second place, and Hal Vogler was involved in a three-way tie for fifth and sixth.

Other point winners were: Mackenzie, in third place with 11 5-6; Central, in fourth position with 10, on Dick Robbins' triumph in the high jump; Northwestern, with 9 5-6, and Western, with four.
