



Ayers, Hamilton, Brown All Place in Events

Ludington's black sheep team, represented at the state high school meet Saturday in East Lansing by five boys, garnered a ninth place and a total of 11 and 43-65 points. Bob Ayers, Bob Brown and Dick Hamilton all placed in the meet and the relay team of Hamilton, Ayers, Lee Rowe and Dick Sequin gained at least a moral victory when they beat out Alpena in the trials to lend strength to an argument started last week that they lost a phot-finish decision in the relay at the Cadillac-Big S regionals.

Ayers polled six of Ludington's 11 plus points when he came in second in the 120-yard high hurdles and was sixth in the 220-yard low hurdles. The 120-yard high hurdles was won by Clyde Hoag of South Haven in 16.3. In the 220-yard low hurdles Ypsilanti's Wolter ran the distance in 24.1.

Hamilton picked up four points when he came in third in the 220-yard dash in a race won by Bob Swain of East Grand Rapids in 20.3.

Brown gained one and 43-65 points when he was in a five-way tie for fourth place in the pole vault and one in 13 in a tie for third place in the high jump. Probably the reason for the unusual number of ties in the pole vault was the fact that the bar was hoisted six inches after five made the ten foot mark. Brown went out on 10'6" and the winning jump was 11'.

A crowd of 5,000 persons witnessed the event which was featured by the unveiling of a statue of Mark Twain, who's story "The Jumping Frog of Calaveras" brought fame to this community.
